

Does the Giant Denmark Base generate electricity from solar energy



Overview

The farm is two hectares and produces electricity approximately corresponding to the annual consumption of 120 households, when taking into account the benefit of using bifacial solar cells that harvest sun both from the front and the back. In 2022, Denmark produced 35 Terawatt-hours (TWh) of electricity, with renewable sources constituting 83.3% of the total electricity mix. Wind energy was the largest contributor at 54%, followed by bioenergy and waste at 23%, and solar energy at 6. Coal accounted for 13% of electricity. At the same time, the costs associated with producing electricity from solar PV (photovoltaics) have dropped significantly in recent years, and solar PV are now one of the most cost-effective and competitive ways of producing electricity. In addition, solar energy is a good complement to wind. Solar power in Denmark amounts to 4,832 MW of grid-connected PV capacity at the end of September 2025, and contributes to a government target to use 100% renewable electricity by 2030 and 100% renewable energy by 2050. Solar power produced 11.2% of Danish electricity generation in 2024. Electricity can be generated in two main ways: by harnessing the heat from burning fuels or nuclear reactions in the form of steam (thermal power) or by capturing the energy of natural forces such as the sun, wind or moving water. Wind energy leads the pack, responsible for roughly 60% of the country's electricity, showcasing Denmark's strong commitment to harnessing this clean resource.
